"Even in the darkest hours, God is changing the hearts of the people of Haiti." This heartfelt statement from Nicky Runk, of Global Outreach Haiti, reflects a spirit of thankfulness that permeates his mission. Nicky and his wife Kristie are currently in the United States



navigating the challenges posed by riots and gang violence in Haiti. Despite the distance, their hearts are firmly anchored in the communities they serve.

Every day, Nicky and Kristie work tirelessly, coordinating with their Haitian partners to ensure that essential supplies reach those in need. Their mission focuses on building wells in hard-to-reach areas, providing clean water and sharing the message of Christ wherever they are welcomed. This calling has become a source of hope and strength, even as the situation in Haiti grows more precarious.

Last year, the couple faced a daunting challenge when they had to evacuate their compound due to gang violence. Many would see this as a reason for despair, but the Runks have chosen a different path. "Why would we be discouraged when we can still fulfill our calling and help the people of Haiti?" Nicky asks with conviction. This unwavering resolve is a testament to their faith and commitment, and a reminder of the blessings that still exist amid hardship.

Instead of focusing on what they've lost or the dangers that loom, the Runks celebrate the relationships they've built,

the lives they've touched, and the faith that sustains them. "God never called us to an easy life, but boy did He call us to a fulfilling one," Nicky says, his eyes reflecting a deep appreciation for the opportunities to serve.

Their attitude of gratitude extends to how they approach their work. By collaborating closely with local leaders, Nicky and Kristie ensure that their initiatives align with the genuine needs of the communities. This grassroots approach not only amplifies their impact but also empowers Haitians to take personal pride in their progress.

As they continue to navigate the challenges from afar, the Runks remain dedicated to spreading hope and inspiration. They share stories of resilience and community, reminding

supporters that even in the most difficult times, there are countless reasons to be thankful. Nicky and Kristie shine as beacons of hope, proving that a heart filled with thankfulness can illuminate even the darkest paths. Their journey serves as a



powerful reminder that gratitude can transform adversity into opportunities for growth and healing.

This ministry played a crucial role when our Cessna F406 was stranded in Bombardopolis, Haiti. They not only stored our plane but also facilitated repairs, enabling us to safely return it to our hangar in Venice for permanent repairs. Hope from Above's services are vital in Haiti, providing medical transportation throughout the mountainous regions to ensure that more families receive the care they need in times of crisis. Their dedication has significantly impacted maternal and infant health in the area. Thanks to their efforts, access to medical care for pregnant women has improved dramatically, leading to a remarkable increase in birth rates and a sharp decline in infant mortality. We are grateful for the partnership and support of Hope from Above, which allows us to continue our mission of serving the communities in Haiti. Together, we are making a difference.

2024 AGAPE FLIGHTS MISSIONARY ENCOURAGEMENT TRIP

I was 15 years old when I first visited Eleuthera, and my memories of the island have always been brilliant hues of blue water, talcum-powdered sand, and delicious seafood. But those memories were replaced with new ones last August when our Agape team went on a trip to visit Bill and Teresa Landers of Eleuthera Bible Training Center. It was a wake-up call to say the least; I did not expect the level of poverty faced by those living on the "other side" of this beautiful island's reality. The contrast was a lot for me to take in. But God's light has a way of surpassing darkness, and in the short time we were there I got to witness His love for the hurting. Some of us went with Teresa to visit a family, where she took provisions and spent time pouring Christ's love into their souls. Little acts of kindness are a natural part of Teresa's day, like when she stopped our van by the side of the road to ask a man she knew if he had found a job. We could tell these thoughtful touches meant a lot to those she came across as their appreciation of her was evident. BETTE GEBRIAN- GRAND'ANSE HEALTH & DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION

Bette Gebrian, a recipient of the Isabel Williams Scholarship, is making a significant impact as the executive director of the Grand'Anse Health and Development Association (GAHDA). With the scholarship funds, she plans to upgrade the failing battery inverter power system for the Our Lady of Perpetual Help Nursing School in Jérémie, Haiti. This upgrade is essential for ensuring reliable electricity, vital for both education and healthcare services. Bette envisions a community where residents can easily access crucial health and development services. She emphasizes collaboration between local populations and service providers to comprehensively address everyone's needs. Since its establishment in 1992, the nursing school has dedicated itself to training skilled professionals. Under Sister Adeline Louissant's leadership since 2009, the school has flourished, currently enrolling over 170 students, with 71 set to graduate this year. The power system upgrade will support educational efforts at the nursing school and enhance



the quality of care in the region. Bette's vision embodies the core values of the Isabel Williams Scholarship, demonstrating how dedicated leadership can transform communities for the better. Her work is a testament to the impact of grassroots initiatives in improving health and education.

NICAISE AVIGNON- COMMUNITIES ORGANIZING FOR HAITIAN ENGAGEMENT & DEVELOPMENT

Nicaise and Madeleine Avignon, recipients of the Isabel Williams Scholarship, are advancing community health through their organization, Communities Organizing for Haitian Engagement and Development (COFHED). Community nurses conduct door-to-door visits to assess needs and provide care, ensuring that health interventions reach those who may be overlooked, particularly in rural areas. By investing in community



healthcare, Nicaise and Madeleine are fostering healthier, more resilient communities. Their work embodies the spirit of the Isabel Williams Scholarship, aimed at empowering individuals dedicated to sustainable change in Haiti. 



PRAYER REQUESTS



They chose "Agape," the Greek word for God's unconditional love, to represent the core of this Christian aviation ministry. This roughly translates Agape Flights to mean "God's Love Flights." Every

week, our aircraft depart from the Agape Flights hangar in Venice, Florida, transporting a variety of necessary and relied upon supplies for our missionary partners so they can be equipped to actively serve out their calling.


