CUBA: SHINING FOR CHRIST IN THE MIDST OF SUFFERING SONIA REHDER- MISSIONARY CARE COORDINATOR



It's been several weeks, but thoughts of my trip to Cuba remain fresh in my mind, as if it were yesterday. Is it because of the unbelievably deplorable living conditions I witnessed? The stories that left me bewildered and wondering how people are even able to survive? These and other atrocities I observed would certainly contribute to my difficulty

in letting go, but that's not why I cannot get Cuba out of my mind. You see, I was blessed to witness something truly special that is only possible with God's abounding mercy and grace. I witnessed an intermingling of joy and sorrow where, with my naked eye, it was hard to distinguish one separate from the other. It's hard to express really, but I saw it in the faces of fellow brothers and sisters in Christ who have "nothing" yet have "everything" because they have the Lord Jesus Christ. He is theirs and they are His and no one can snatch them out of His loving hands. They have discovered the truth that HE is enough.

I was reminded of many valuable lessons in the few days spent with these beautiful souls. One was from a pastor who prayed for our Agape team. I was overcome when he asked God to provide for our needs. His heartfelt prayer shook me and my mind shouted, "I have no needs! How can I say I have needs when I see you all struggling to have your basic needs met? Yet, with all your lack, you are praying for me?" His unselfish prayer stirred my heart and reminded me to never take God's goodness for granted and to keep praying for those less fortunate.

Many scriptures come to mind when I think of the dear people I was blessed to meet, but this one really stands out: "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus also may be manifested in our bodies." (2 Cor. 4:8-10, ESV). Their affliction is real.

It is deep. Where is their hope of escape? It would be so easy to fall into despair. But the joy that I saw reflected in their eyes and their broad, sweet smiles told me of an inner strength that keeps them from being broken to the point of hopelessness. That strength comes from the great



treasure held within their hearts - the gospel of Jesus Christ - that birthed eternal hope and helps them to survive earthly struggles. Lord, I pray, please bless and protect them all!

FROM THE MISSION FIELD



God is moving powerfully in Haiti, and Roger & Margaret Clark of New Life Mission are witnessing His faithfulness firsthand. A significant moment of joy came just two weeks ago when the New Life Church in Lazile completed the roof on its new building. Since the 2021 earthquake destroyed their original structure, the congregation had been gathering under tarps and sticks. Now, they have a proper place to worship and grow. Lazile, a mountain town five hours from Port-au-Prince, has seen a population surge as people flee the capital's violence. The town's population has more than doubled in the past

year, bringing with it increased need, and great opportunity. The church in Lazile now stands at the center of a growing mission field, ready to share the saving love of Christ with newcomers seeking hope and stability. Despite rising violence and spiritual darkness across the nation, the church of Jesus Christ is standing firm. As Matthew 16:18 reminds us, "I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." The Clarks have seen both visible and spiritual battles intensify during their 43 years in Haiti, but God's church endures. Today, all seven New Life Churches continue their ministry, even as four operate in gang-controlled areas. The challenges are great, but so is the harvest. Pray for boldness, protection, and a continued outpouring of God's Spirit as the Gospel goes forth in Haiti.

Recently, we received a beautiful message from Krista and Marc Germeil, and it moved us deeply. They shared the story of a sweet little boy in their community who just turned one. That may sound ordinary, but his first birthday is truly a miracle. After losing his mama at only four months old, his future was uncertain. In many cases, children in his situation are abandoned to orphanages. But not this time. Because of the formula shipped through Agape Flights, this precious boy was able to stay with his family; loved, nurtured, and thriving right where he belongs. Krista wrote: "It takes a village to raise a precious child... and we are so glad that you are a part of ours." We're humbled and honored to be a small part of the Germeils' ministry. Krista and Marc are on the ground every day, helping the next generation find hope and purpose in God through discipleship, education, and community care. The real





heroes are those holding these babies, teaching the teens, praying with the hurting, and pointing people to Christ. To Krista, Marc, and your entire team, thank you for letting us serve alongside you. This story is why we do what we do.



Cassidy Marechal, co-founder of Klere Haiti alongside her husband Frantzy, continues to walk, both literally and figuratively, with Haitian families. Together, they trek up hills, cross canals, and climb mountainsides to visit families in their homes. These home visits remain Cassidy's favorite part of the work. After long days behind a computer managing newsletters, fundraising, and finances, these visits remind her why they began Klere in the first place. On one visit, Cassidy and Frantzy met a new Klere mom, while nearby sat another mother who had been part of the program since its very first year. Cassidy gave the new mom a macrame bracelet and a photo made by her son. Frantzy smiled as he noticed the familiar face watching from the side. "You remember this?"

he said. "We haven't changed anything." That little boy, once just starting out in Klere, is now a young man, riding a motorcycle to support his family and preparing to study plumbing. His mother smiled warmly and said she prays God will continue to grow Klere so that it can bless many more. Her smile alone felt like the greatest encouragement. Klere is no longer just a program, it has become woven into the very fabric of these families' lives.

ISABEL WILLIAMS MEDICAL FUND SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The Isabel Williams Medical Fund Scholarship honors Isabel Williams' 50-year nursing career and her deep commitment to compassionate healthcare. This scholarship supports efforts to meet the medical needs of people served by Agape Flights' affiliated missionaries.

REAL HOPE FOR HAITI, LORELL MOISE, PORT-AU-PRINCE

This year, the Isabel Williams Scholarship proudly honors Lorell Moise of Real Hope for Haiti, based in Port-au-Prince. Lorell is the heart behind Formula for Hope: Strengthening Families, a ministry that reaches some of Haiti's most vulnerable: infants who have lost their mothers or whose mothers are unable to breastfeed due to illness or crisis. These tiny lives face overwhelming odds: malnutrition, illness, and the deep emotional trauma that comes from maternal loss or separation. But through Formula for Hope, Lorell and her team offer more than just physical nourishment; they offer love, dignity,



and the chance to thrive. With the help of the scholarship, Formula for Hope will provide 3 to 4 months of life-saving formula for 19 at-risk infants. But this program goes far beyond bottles. Caregivers



receive hygiene education, the babies are closely monitored for healthy growth and motor development, and families are surrounded with spiritual and emotional support. Lorell sees each child not as a number, but as a precious life full of potential. In a place where resources are scarce and suffering is common, her work stands as a powerful reminder that hope is still alive. Thanks to Lorell and her team's compassion and tireless dedication, these children have a real chance, not just to survive, but to grow physically and emotionally strong. The Isabel Williams Scholarship celebrates leaders like Lorell, who embody grace in action. Her ministry is not just saving lives, it's restoring families, rebuilding hope, and honoring the God-given worth of every child.

CHILDREN'S HOPE EDUCATIONAL NUTRITIONAL PROGRAM, REVEREND PIERRE VALDEMA, PORT-AU-PRINCE



The Isabel Williams Scholarship is honored to recognize Rev. Pierre Valdema, a devoted servant leader and the driving force behind the Children's Hope Educational Nutritional Program, known in Haiti as Programme Nutritionnel Educatif Espoir des Enfants. Located in the heart of Croix-des-Bouquets, this nonprofit health center is a place of refuge and healing for the 11,284 residents of this underserved commune. Rev. Valdema's vision is clear: to offer quality healthcare to the most vulnerable, those who simply cannot afford it. Under his compassionate leadership, the center provides far more than basic care. Services include gynecology-obstetrics, pediatrics, general medicine, psychology, pharmacy, and laboratory diagnostics- an extraordinary range for a region with so few resources. Families come not

only for medicine, but for dignity, comfort, and a listening ear. Thanks to the Isabel Williams Scholarship, the center will now be able to replace broken and outdated medical equipment, tools essential for delivering safe and effective care. With these improvements, the facility can serve even more patients with accuracy, compassion, and hope. Rev. Valdema's work is rooted in deep faith and a profound love for his people. His ministry is not just about treating illness; it's about restoring wholeness to individuals and communities who have been overlooked for too long. The Isabel Williams Scholarship celebrates Rev. Valdema's unwavering commitment to healing and justice in Haiti.
